PIGGY BANK BAZAAR... Greetings from Kermit!

You humans are just AMAZING!! Once again, you've put together a Wonderful, Successful Piggy Bank Bazaar, filling the church halls with smiling people, young and old, and the rooms with wonderful goodies for the young folks to give to their loved ones at Christmas!!

Let me get right to the numbers – I know you humans are interested in that! We counted 351 children shopping, 40 more than last year. We sold 3,794 gifts:

- 762 women's gifts
- 250 gifts for animals
- 736 men's gifts
- 659 children's gifts
- 778 Christmas gifts
- 187 photographs in frames
- 192 personalized gifts
- 230 flower arrangements and plants

Total Bazaar income was \$8,444.51. Expenses for 2017 were \$4,001.25, for a net profit of \$4443.26.

The Youth Group also had a very successful day with their refreshments and bake sale, bringing in \$567.90.

Most of Piggy Bank's profits are donated throughout the year, usually to activities involving children. In the past year, donations totaling \$3,457.46 were given to:

- The NHRC Youth Group
- The Church Property Fund
- The Mommy Connection
- The Roof Fund
- The Girl Scouts Jewelry workshop
- The Sunday School

In addition, Piggy Bank supplies were shared with the Sunday School Lenten Project, Sparrows Nest, and Rural & Migrant Ministry Holiday Toy Store.

All of this is made possible only through YOUR participation and YOUR donation of supplies through the year. A Great Big Froggy Thank you to everyone who volunteered on the Big Day – Mrs. Ray estimates (and her estimates are VERY good!!) that about 150 people were involved in Piggy Bank Bazaar day. A special thank you goes out to the Girls Scouts who acted as guides this year. Also, many people worked through the year – participating in Wednesday Workshops, designing and building Take Home Kits, publicizing and inviting friends to the Bazaar, and in just so many other ways. This really is YOUR success!!!

Thinking ahead to next year, we'll need lots of new craft ideas and craft supplies, since we'll have to accumulate another 3000+ gifts. We'll also need a large supply of handled grocery or department store bags. The Gift Wrapping folks will need bunches of gift bags, tissue paper, ribbons, small boxes, and wrapping paper. Christmas mugs and other mugs, Christmas ornaments, artificial greens and wreaths, silk flowers, baskets, and jewelry making supplies are needed, too.

All the Piggy Bank folks will take some time off now, and the Wednesday Morning Workshops will start up again in February. Even this little frog will be hopping off to his pond for a while to recuperate, and try to stay warm.

Before I go, though, I'd like to ask that when you see Mrs. Ray (humans call her "Carol") you say "THANK

YOU” to her, because even though lots and LOTS of people make the Piggy Bank Bazaar happen, it’s her sure hand on all the threads that weave it all together!! (I’d thank her myself but, hey, I’m a frog – just because I can hop across a keyboard doesn’t mean I can talk!! Whoever heard of such a thing?!)

The items are sold at a 50 – 70% discount, and the proceeds go to support the annual retreat and community outreach programs of the **Daughters of Sarah**. Parents are able to choose gifts they know their children are wishing for while allowing them to maintain their dignity by purchasing and giving the gifts directly.

Wish Lists are available at the Information Center and collection boxes are in the Gathering Area and Ed Center. **Please note** that gifts need to be at the church no later than Wednesday, December 13th.

PRAYERS NEEDED FOR FARMWORKERS... As you and yours gather around your holiday tables and offer up your prayers of blessing, please include those who labor each day so that our tables are abundantly filled. Amid all the discussions across the world and our nation about immigrants, be reminded that we are fed by

those who come to care for and harvest the crops.

RMM's Outreach Coordinator on Long Island worked tirelessly last year with one of his workers whose 18 year old brother was in a detention center. These brothers came to escape the violence and terror in El Salvador where their 7 year old brother recently witnessed his 26 year old neighbor killed by a gang. The lack of response from the detention center and lack of resources to help deeply saddened and frustrated the efforts of our staff member who reports *there is no need to go through all the details, the system is clearly meant to break and humiliate our brothers and sisters.* This is a familiar part of every day life for all of RMM's staff across the State.

This is not an isolated situation, our staff encounter this type of humiliation in all areas of the state, our young people live in fear that their parents will be taken away and sent to such a detention center or worse deported leaving them here as orphans. Just this week, on Monday, November 13, 2017 the father of one of our WNY day campers was deported! And, thousands of young people live in fear of losing their DACA status that protects them from deportation to places that they have never lived and know nothing about.

In thanking those who came to help him in his efforts to free this young worker, Nathan shares a prayer that was sent to him by a friend in the Episcopal Diocese of Long Island where the LI office of RMM is located.
