Sat Nov 4 (10am-2pm) and Sun Nov 5 (before and after the service) Handmade Card Sale



PIGGY BANK BAZAAR



Greetings from Kermit!

It's almost time for the 47th Piggy Bank Bazaar! It will be held Saturday, December 2nd, 2023, from 9 a.m. until Noon. It's a Wonderful opportunity for children to do Christmas shopping, since all our gifts are priced at no more than \$3.00. Guides are available to take the younger children shopping, and to assist them with cashiers and free gift wrapping. Parents may act as guides for their children, too, or they can wait in Fellowship Hall and have some refreshments. After shopping, children are invited to enjoy some cookies.

The Wednesday Morning Workshops are underway, preparing goodies for the Bazaar. With lots of easy craft projects available, some are bound to be perfect for YOU, so please join in. October workshops will be on the 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th, at 9:30 a.m. in rooms 13 and 15.

Last year's room arrangements for the Bazaar worked very smoothly, so we'll be using the same ones this year, with cashiers in the lobby area. Specific tables will include gifts for women, children, men and pets, as well as Christmas gifts, floral arrangements, and personalized gifts. We'll also have a photography area, where pictures can be taken and put into ornamental frames. With all these tables to manage, along with the gift wrapping area, cashiers, and, of course, cleanup, THE BAZAAR NEEDS LOTS OF VOLUNTEERS! In addition to the Big Day (December 2nd) we'll also need volunteers for Set-up day (December 1st.) Sign-up sheets will be available in the Gathering Area in October. If you'd like to volunteer, you can also contact Carol Ray (jimcarolray@verizon.net). To have the Bazaar run smoothly, we'll need at least 100 volunteers.

The Bazaar has to be heavily advertised to the public in November, so we're looking for outlets to promote it. We hope you'll consider supporting this great event for children. If you have ideas, or can help get the word out, please contact Arra Mowry, Joan Heller or Carol Ray to get posters, post cards or softcopy info for distribution. There are post cards in various locations around the church.

As the Workshops continue, supplies we can really use include Halloween candy (we need this in November), new pet toys, 8½" x 11" photo paper, macramé cord, seashells, small and tiny pinecones, tinsel garland, scrap booking paper, stickers, rubber bands, paperclips, good scissors, jingle bells, dowel sticks, craft paints, paint brushes, ribbon, vases, silk flowers, floral foam and floral mosses. We'll need dozens of homemade cookies for Fellowship Hall, plus small plates, napkins and cups. Many children like to buy house plants at the Bazaar. If you can donate house plants, we would like them each to have a tag identifying the plant, with care instructions. The plants shouldn't be large. For the Bazaar, we'll need large paper bags with handles, tissue paper, gift wrapping, gift bags, gift ribbons, and Scotch tape. Donations can be left in room 15.

It's time for me to hop away for another month. Before I go, though, I want to share some things I've been talking about with Mrs. Ray, my nice human friend who's been in charge of the Piggy Bank

Bazaar for 40 years!! What she enjoys most is all the people she gets to talk with. She meets all of the more than 100 volunteers who contribute at the Bazaar and throughout the year. On Bazaar Day, she gets to meet parents, and watch all the children as they move from table to table in search of little treasures. She also has a hand in everything that happens – planning, inventory management, table arrangement, working with all the volunteers, and the quick cleanup at the end of the Bazaar. The common thread is providing a happy time for all of our guests. Much of each year's work has involved the Wednesday Morning Workshops, where a core group of people enjoy turning craft kits into individual items. Mrs. Ray has enjoyed gathering all the supplies generously contributed through the year, and imagining and creating many of these kits. But now Mrs. Ray says she's getting older (all appearances to the contrary), and many things (lifting heavy boxes, climbing up to get things from upper shelves, moving tables, etc.) are becoming problematic. She would like to continue working as part of the Wednesday folks and putting some of the kits together, but not the 100+ we'll need for next year. She hopes you'll consider helping the Bazaar, the Wednesday workers, the congregation and the children by providing some of the Piggy Bank leadership as she steps aside, so it will continue into the future.

That's all for this time – next month there will be more details about this year's Piggy Bank Bazaar.

ENDING CROP HUNGER ONE STEP AT A TIME WALK CROP HUNGER WALK Sunday, October 15th from 10am to 2pm


