Letter from the Pastor

Greetings to New Hackensack Reformed Church family,

Well, it's that time of year, the beginning of fall and the start of schools. This also is the time that the church family begins special programs and opportunities to connect with God and with one another.

During my seminary training, which happened many years ago, I did my Senior Thesis on a famous theologian, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He died in prison in 1945 in Germany. He was always in great resistance to the Nazi regime including vocal opposition to Adolf Hitler. His writings included a book entitled, "Life Together". There is a chapter on Community, which has greatly influenced my ministry.

"God has put the Word into the mouth of people in order that it may be communicated to others. When one person is struck by the word, he speaks it to others. God has willed that we should seek and find God's love in the witness of a brother or sister in Christ. Therefore the Christian needs another Christian who speaks God's word to him. This clarifies the goal of all Christian Community: that we meet one another as bringers of the message of salvation." (Page 25)

It is my dream to bring these teachings and learnings to as many parishioners as I can. I do hope you will join us in worship and participate in the life of New Hackensack Reformed Church.
