

Meaning of the Sacrament

Beloved in the Lord, the holy supper which we are about to celebrate is a feast of remembrance, of communion, and of hope. We come in remembrance that our Lord Jesus Christ was sent of the Father into the world to assume our flesh and blood and to fulfill for us all obedience to the divine law, even to the bitter death of the cross. By his death, resurrection, and ascension, he established a new and eternal covenant of grace and reconciliation that we might be accepted of God and never be forsaken by him. And so we come to this meal in hope, believing that this bread and this cup are a pledge and foretaste of the feast of love of which we shall partake when his kingdom has fully come. This meal

unites us all into one body, as we prepare for the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Invitation

Now is the time of watching and waiting – a time to expect new life. Now is the season of hope unfolding – the dark winter season when hope is waiting to be born.

Let us gather around Christ's table with receptive and willing spirits. May our souls magnify the Lord, and our spirits rejoice in God our Savior! All those who have been baptized, and confess their faith in Christ are welcome to the Lord's table.
