SENIOR MEAL PROGRAM:

Since we no longer serve the 100 guests at the Homeless Shelter, Outreach has decided to continue serving those who are in need. There is a Senior Housing operates by Hudson River Housing for extremely low income seniors. This Housing operates similar to Liberty Station where those who cannot afford apartments or houses, are placed here for a nominal rent price.

Every tenant is responsible for their own meals which we understand to be canned meals and ramen noodles. These seniors do not get real meals so we thought it would be nice to present a nice meal once a month. The meals can be anything you would like to make. During cold weather days, simple soup and sandwiches; chili with bread and butter; Sloppy Joes; Beef Stroganoff casserole. During warmer weather simple franks and beans, sandwiches, wraps, and salads.

If you are interested in preparing a meal for 40-45 seniors, please sign up in the Gathering Area. You can sign up to prepare a main dish, bring salad and dressing, bread and butter or even a nice dessert. It would be nice if you could deliver it as well. It is extremely easy to get there and drop off door is very convenient. If you would like to prepare a meal but may have difficulty paying for the meal ingredients, contact Arra for some financial assistance.

LIBERTY STATION:

Outreach continues to collect grocery items for our previously homeless American Veterans living at Liberty Station. Donation bins are located by Keith's office and in the Gathering Area.

Come "Chase the Winter Blues" away! We will brighten your morning with great ideas to share and fun crafts to do. The Wednesday Morning Workshop is a warm, sunny, friendly, happy part of our day that gives us purpose as we create gifts for the children's craft fair. We have been busy putting together many different types and skill levels of Kits for you to choose from, whether it be cut & paste, sand & paint, sew & stuff, arrange & assemble, we have it all!! We will meet at 9:30am to 11:30am in the Education Center, rooms 13 and 15 on March 5th, 12th, 19th and 26th. (Note: There is still a chance winter weather could impact our Wednesday Morning Workshop meetings, sooo... if that be the case, the Wappingers' Schools are closed or even on a delay, there will be no meeting for us.)

"Stock Check", There are a number of items in our Crafting Cupboard that we used up last year and need to Restock. First: plastic storage bins, brown paper bags with handles, department store handle bags, Christmas gift bags, tissue paper, small jewelry size boxes with lids, and Christmas big roll wrapping paper (for our Bazaar Day Tables). Update from RCA Missionaries Andrew & Amy Fields

Andrew and Amy and their family are currently on hiatus from their posting at the Biblical Seminary of Colombia while Andrew pursues a Master of Theology degree at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, MI. Below is their February update letter, titled "The Hope to Which We Have Been Called."

Dear friends,

It's hard to believe that we are already four weeks into a new semester! Let's catch up on what has been happening with the Fields since we last wrote.

Andrew's Studies

In December, Andrew finished his first semester in the Master of Theology program at Western Theological Seminary. The report card came back great, but more importantly, he feels like he is growing as a scholar through this experience. Last semester, he grew in appreciation for how the evangelical tradition in the US has shaped Latin American churches, what it means to be a human being from a Christian perspective, and how different factors play into our theological beliefs. These are all themes that he is hoping to share with our students when we return to Colombia. Also, he received a lot of encouraging feedback from the faculty at Western about his research project and possibilities for future doctoral studies.

As he is in the early stages of this semester, the theme of hope has come up often. He is taking a class on Ephesians, where God secures our hope through Jesus's resurrection and the Spirit of adoption. A course on Christian beliefs about the "Last Things" has been a good reminder that what we hope for shapes how we live now. A class on the Early Church's views on humanity is challenging him to see how our hope in the resurrection of the body reveals much about what it means to be truly human. While all of these courses are shaping Andrew to think deeply and coherently about these subjects and communicate more clearly and persuasively, they have also forced him to think about how his teaching and ministry at the Biblical Seminary of Colombia can be infused with hope. It has renewed calling to help form students whose lives and ministries testify to the hope we have in Christ.

Prayer Requests

We ask that you would pray for Andrew as he continues his studies this semester, especially that God would grant him wisdom to attend to the various courses and research tasks that he is doing while keeping his eyes set on the hope to which God has called us (Ephesians 1:18).

Speaking of the start of a new semester, the Biblical Seminary of Colombia will return to class on Monday. We miss being able to share life with the students, and Andrew misses being in class with them (he does not miss grading!!). **Please pray for the students and our colleagues in Colombia as they step into this new academic year.** We especially ask for prayer for abundant financial provision for students and wisdom for Seminary leadership as they face economic challenges.

Family Life

As for our family life, we are trying to be intentional about enjoying the different blessings of living in Michigan at this moment. It was a delight to spend Christmas with Andrew's family in St. Louis and then host Amy's mom here for a week. However, we are a little discombobulated because normally this is our long break between school years in Colombia. Rushing back to school in early January felt odd! But the kids are both doing well in school and enjoying time with new friends. We are particularly grateful that Amos's teachers have noticed a lot of growth in him over the past month, because he had been struggling with the move more than we had anticipated.

Snow!

January is one of the warmest months in Colombia, but here it is a winter wonderland. The kids had almost a whole week off school to enjoy the snow and frigid temperatures.

Join us in thanking God for this opportunity to recharge as a family and for the growth that both kids are showing in school.





Thank you for your continued support and prayers. We are grateful for you and look forward to sharing more about our time in the US soon.
